# Sweet Potato Brownie Recipe (serves 12)

### Ingredients

¼ cup milk

1 cup cooked sweet potato mashed (250g)

½ cup brown sugar (60g)

¼ cup vegetable/light olive oil

1 tsp vanilla essence


½ cup flour

½ cup cocoa powder

1 tsp baking powder

### Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 180C. Line 2x loaf tin with baking paper
- 2. Combine milk, sweet potato, sugar, oil, vanilla in large bowl. Mix well.
- 3. Add flour, cocoa powder and baking powder to the bowl. Stir to create a thick batter.
- 4. Spread mixture into prepared tin and smooth surface.
- 5. Bake for 40 minutes, until edges have pulled away from the side of the pan.
- 6. Cool in the pan for 10 minutes. Transfer to a rack to cool completely before cutting.
