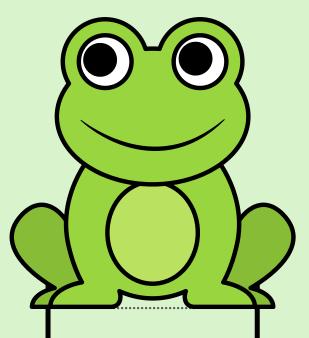
Word from the Principal continued

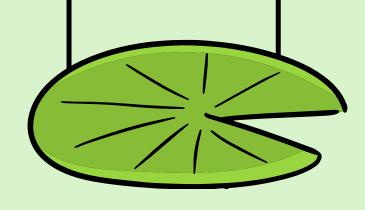

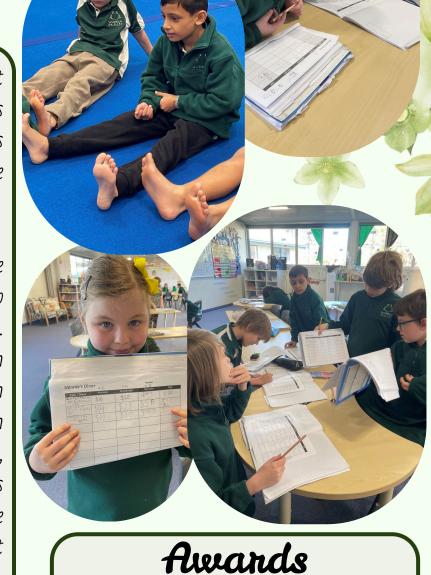


Middle

Welcome to Divraj! Divraj has just joined the middle grade and has already begun building great friendships with his peers. We're so happy to have you with us.

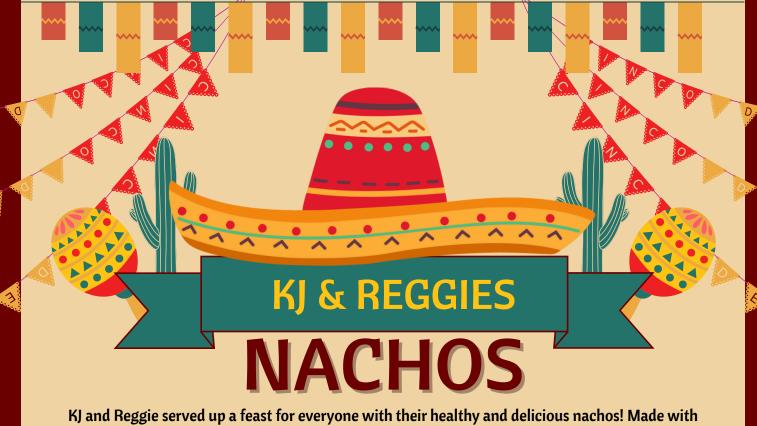

They then had to examine what would happen when someone came in to order 2, 4, and then 8 of their items. Students learned all about doubling, doubling the double and then doubling that next double

Students have also created poetry that reflects on a memory. Students were tasked with using their five senses to describe what they saw, heard, smelt, tasted and felt in that moment.

The Nacho-Making Process

Prepare the base – Spread out the special Mexican corn chips on large trays.

Add flavour – Sprinkle over the secret spices to give the chips a kick.

Layer the toppings – Scatter on freshly chopped red capsicum and spring onion.

Cheesy melt – Sprinkle pizza cheese generously over the top.

Bake until golden – Warm the trays in the oven until the cheese is melted and bubbly.

Finish with freshness – Add spoonfuls of salsa sauce, dollops of sour cream, and slices of creamy avocado.

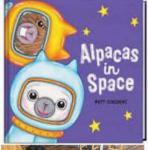






The children have explored Space for Science week.
