
Welcome Eli, Cheyanne and Divraj!




Last week our junior students joined our senior learning teams for STEAM. Our seniors showed such patience and great communication skills to involved their little friends in identifying different types of soil

Well done to KJ and Arrow for giving it a go and making something the whole school could enjoy.












Kinder's busy start to Term 3

- Once updated, please provide the updated immunisation statement to the kindergarten office.

As part of our commitment to a safe and healthy environment for all children, we are required to maintain current immunisation records in line with the **No Jab, No Play** legislation.


If you're unsure about your child's immunisation status or need help accessing their AIR statement, please contact:


