Missing a day of school here and there may not seem like much, but absences add up!

When a student misses days a month...

They will miss 20 DAYS a year.

They will miss 30 HOURS of math over the school year.

They will miss
60 HOURS of reading & writing over the school year.

They will miss over 1 YEAR of school by graduation.

When a student misses month...

They will miss 40 DAYS a year.

They will miss 60 HOURS of math over the school year.

They will miss

120 HOURS of reading & writing over the school year.

They will miss over 2 YEARS of school by graduation.

KINDERGART REGISTRATION

Kindergarten registrations and expressions of interest can now be made through Council's NEW Kindergarten Central Registration Service.

> Register between 1 May - 30 June each year or lodge an EO





REGISTRATION

When should I register my child for kindergarten?

If your child is turning three or four years old before 30 April, they can be registered for 3 or 4 year old kindergarten.



You can complete an

Expression of Interest any
time before your child is
due to start kindergarten,
we will notify you when
it's time to complete a
registration for 3 or 4-yearold kindergarten.

Lodge an EOI online for free.

If your child is old enough for 3 or 4 year old kindergarten, make sure you apply using Council's **Kindergarten Central Registration Service** between 1 May and 30 June to be eligible for first round offers.

Online registration is free.
