She will be running literacy focused tutoring groups each Thursday and Friday with our Senior students in the Wellbeing room. Training our teachers is imperative to support your children's learning. This year in our AIP we have a focus on improving our whole school's teacher and learning practices in Numeracy and Literacy and improving our transition to secondary school.

Miss G is our Numeracy specialist and has attended several numeracy professional development days over last year and this year is focusing on developing our teachers' skills. Miss G organised the professional development day last Friday for our school. The day was fabulous, and all teachers are now inspired to implement many of the skills and learning tools in their classroom.

On the first Friday back all our staff attend a literacy professional development day which has inspired them all. Miss D is leading the way, running writing focused lessons in each of our rooms, sharing good practice with each of our teachers.

Promoting Safety Around Our School

As we continue to prioritise the safety and well-being of our students, staff, and community, it is imperative that we address certain concerns regarding traffic and pedestrian safety around our school premises.

- **1. Speeding is Not Acceptable Near a Schools:** Speeding vehicles pose a significant threat to the safety of our students and pedestrians. We urge all drivers to adhere to the posted speed limits, especially in school zones. Excessive speed reduces reaction time and increases the likelihood of accidents, particularly in areas where children are present. Please be mindful of your speed and drive cautiously, especially during peak drop-off and pick-up times.
- **2. Correct Use of School Crossings at All Times:** Our designated school crossings are in place to provide a safe passage for students and pedestrians. It is crucial for everyone to use these crossings correctly and responsibly. Students should be instructed to cross only at designated areas and to wait for the crossing guard's signal before proceeding. Drivers must also be vigilant and yield to pedestrians at all marked crossings.
- **3. Crossing the Street Safely:** Teaching children proper pedestrian safety is essential for their well-being. Parents and or guardians, please take the time to educate your children on safe pedestrian practices, including looking both ways before crossing the street, using crosswalks whenever possible, and making eye contact with drivers before stepping onto the road. Additionally, encourage older students to serve as role models by following these safety guidelines themselves.

By working together as a community and prioritising safety, we can create a secure environment for everyone.
