

Smoke - Free Policy

Rationale:

- Smoking is banned within four metres of an entrance to all primary and secondary schools in Victoria, and within the school grounds. Tobacco Act 1987.
- The ban includes all activities that take place on school grounds and within school buildings, both during and outside of school hours.
- It is a legislative requirement that each school installs suitable 'No smoking' signs at all entrances to the school grounds.

<u>Aims</u>:

- Complying with Health and Safety Legislation & Employment Law.
- Protecting the students, staff, and members of the community to exposure to second hand smoke.
- To ensure a smoke free environment for students, families, staff, volunteers and visitors
- Raising awareness of the dangers associated with exposure to tobacco smoke and promoting the benefit of a smoke free lifestyle to our students
- To provide information to staff and families about the health benefits of not smoking.

Implementation:

- "Smoke free school" signs will be displayed in visible locations around the school
- Inform the school community of the Victorian Government policy and smoke free schools
- Departmental employees are also able to access the Employee Assistance Program, a short term, professional and confidential counselling service by contacting Converge International on 1300 361 008
- Tobacco education curriculum materials support schools to provide a smoke-free environment. Information
